1.1 Brief message from the president

Dear members of EACES:

I am writing this brief note to you since I would like to encourage you to organize small workshops or conferences, which EACES can financially support with a maximum payment of 800 Euro. I also would like to turn your attention to an online conference that deals with labor markets in times of war. Finally, I would like to have two flyers published in this issue of the Newsletter. The flyers deal with two volumes of Mario Nuti’s seminal work edited by Saul Estrin and Milica Uvalic.

Regarding EACES co-sponsored events, this year there were thus far one workshop and two conferences organized by EACES members that have been co-financed by us:

1. The hybrid conference organized by the Faculty of Economics and Business Administration at the University of Szeged with the title “Decades of crises: from competitiveness to resilience - via the bumpy road of sustainability”, which took place on the 14-15 April 2023 in Szeged (Hungary). We definitely have the resources to co-finance similar events in 2023 and 2024. Please send a note to Jürgen Jerger and me that describes the event that you would like to organize, and we will be happy to support your endeavor.

Finally, I would like to turn your attention to an IZA online conference that Norberto Pignatti and I are co-organizing and that will take place on the 27th and the 28th of October 2023. The theme of the conference is "Labor Markets and Innovation in Times of War and Reconstruction." Alas, due to the Russian aggression against Ukraine and the continuing war on Ukrainian territory, the theme of the conference is of great political relevance. Let me reproduce those research questions from the call for papers that will be addressed, at least partially, by the conference presentations:

- What is the labor market experience of Internally Displaced Persons (IDP) regarding employment, youth unemployment, long-term

unemployment, and wages relative to local individuals not affected by displacement?

- How does the loss of property, human capital and social networks affect the future economic activity of war-affected individuals as salaried workers, self-employed and entrepreneurs? How do war-related interruptions in education and qualification contribute to slow economic growth and rising inequality in the long run?
- What are the potential labor market consequences for individuals who are physically or psychologically traumatized by war exposure?
- How do labor markets of neighboring countries cope with a massive influx of refugees?
- Which policies and labor market institutions of neighboring countries are conducive to facilitate labor market integration of international refugees?

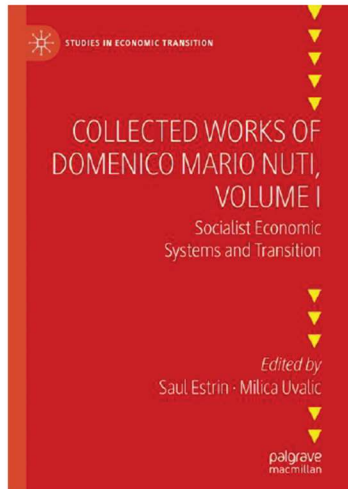

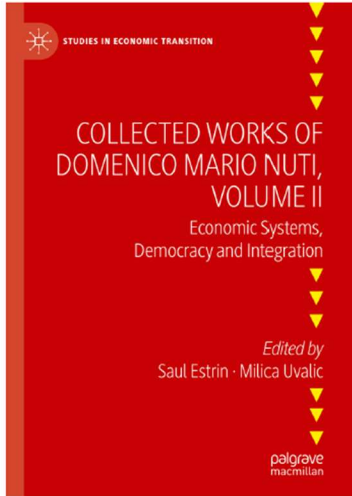

This volume gives particular attention to Nuti's views about how economic systems evolve, about the possibilities for various forms of economic democracy; and his analysis of East-West integration and globalization. The volume also contains a bibliography of his works. Domenico Mario Nuti was Professor of Economics at La Sapienza University in Rome and the European University Institute in Florence. He also held positions at the University of Cambridge, University of Birmingham, and the London Business School. Saul Estrin is Emeritus Professor of Managerial Economics and Strategy at LSE. Milica Uvalic is Professor of Economics at the University of Perugia.
